**Cuturi Gallery** is a Singapore-based contemporary art gallery founded in December 2019 on the belief that art should be empowering and meaningful for all. The gallery focuses on representing and supporting a new wave of Singaporean artists through residencies and exhibitions both in Singapore and globally. Additionally, the gallery collaborates with emerging and established artists from around the world and prides itself in creating bridges between the East and the West.

In 2020, Cuturi Gallery launched its in-house residency programme in Singapore, inviting local and international artists to complete a residency which concludes with a solo presentation. In November 2022, the gallery started a London exhibition programme located at Cromwell Place in South Kensington. Diminishing aristocratic traditions and providing transparency in an art world that is at times daunting, Cuturi Gallery presents an inclusive and democratised art ecosystem that fosters greater collaboration, understanding and appreciation of art amongst artists, collectors and the industry at large.

Nestled in a conservation shophouse of 400 sqm, Cuturi Gallery stands in Singapore's vibrant arts and cultural precinct of Kampong Glam, home to a myriad of independent art spaces and museums. Spread across three levels, the ground floor is dedicated to the gallery's exhibition spaces, with the remaining levels housing multi-functional art spaces and resident studios. The building also features a rooftop opening for the gallery to host events and programmes with artists and collectors.

Cuturi Gallery is delighted to be the art exhibition venue sponsor for *Ocean Grace*, an exhibition in support of the *Prince Albert II of Monaco Foundation*. The exhibition will feature stunning sculptures of famous Hollywood characters, including a sculpture paying homage to the late Grace Kelly, created by *Marcos Marin* and the beautiful marine photography by the duo, *Olivier Jude* and *Sylvie Laurent*, who are the visionary pair behind *PHOCTOPUS*.

Known for his work in optical and kinetic art, **Marcos Marin** has received considerable acclaim, especially for his unique portraits and sculptures of public figures, often using high-contrast patterns to achieve depth and movement in his pieces. As a painter, graphic artist, and sculptor, Marin blends figurative and abstract techniques, often manipulating celebrity portraits and famous masterpieces to engage viewers in a visual dialogue, which he calls the pursuit of the "fourth dimension." His works, inspired by artists like Dalí and Chuck Close, create trompe l'oeil effects that appear abstract up close but reveal recognisable figures from afar.

Olivier Jude, an accomplished photographer, and partner Sylvie Laurent, a diver and model, capture vivid, natural scenes beneath the water's surface to showcase the unique ecosystems and intricate beauty of marine life, blending artistic skill with conservation messaging. The duo emphasises natural beauty by opting for raw, authentic portrayals and deliberately steering clear of digital retouching. Their images are celebrated for revealing the harmony between human influence and natural underwater architecture, creating a sense of both urgency and respect for marine preservation efforts.

All profits from the event will benefit the **Prince Albert II of Monaco Foundation**, acting for the protection of the environment, endangered species, clean water, and sustainable development.

Olivier Jude and Sylvie Laurent, the visionary pair behind PHOCTOPUS, are a Monaco-based duo specialising in underwater photography to foster environmental awareness. They represent their Monegasque identity as members of the Monegasque Federation of Aquatic Activities (FMAS).

Jude, an accomplished photographer, and Laurent, a diver and model, capture vivid, natural scenes beneath the water's surface to showcase the unique ecosystems and intricate beauty of marine life. Their work extends beyond the waters of the Principality of Monaco, from the Mediterranean to remote oceanic locations like Malaysia's Sipadan Island, blending artistic skill with conservation messaging.

With exhibitions throughout Europe and numerous accolades in international underwater photography competitions, they aim to inspire audiences about the urgent need to protect marine environments and highlight the underwater heritage of all seas and oceans. The duo emphasises natural beauty, choosing to forgo digital retouching in favour of raw, authentic portrayals. Their images are celebrated for revealing the harmony between human influence and natural underwater architecture, creating a sense of both urgency and respect for marine preservation efforts.



Marcos Marin is a Brazilian artist from São Paulo, celebrated for his optical and kinetic art, particularly his dynamic portraits and sculptures of public figures that use high-contrast patterns to create depth. As a painter, graphic artist, and sculptor, Marin blends figurative and abstract techniques, often manipulating celebrity portraits and famous masterpieces to engage viewers in a visual dialogue, which he calls the pursuit of the "fourth dimension." His works, inspired by artists like Dalí and Chuck Close, create trompe l'oeil effects that appear abstract up close but reveal recognisable figures from afar. Recently, he has also incorporated classic architectural monuments and landscapes into his art.

In 2004, Marin established a connection with Monaco, where he created portraits and sculptures honouring figures like Princess Grace and Prince Rainier III, earning recognition from the Monegasque royal family. For several years, he collaborated with his primary patron, Pierre Cardin, at Cardin's residence in lacoste

His monumental works are now featured in prominent art collections and public spaces worldwide, and he continues to exhibit internationally, contributing pieces to galleries and events. With more than 30 portraits of presidents and royal families from around the globe, Marín is celebrated as a significant artist in the field of contemporary portraiture.


